

UNKNOWN SOLDIER We know by a detailed survey in 1948 that a soldier was buried there but since a flood destroyed the church records there are no records of this burial. We think he should at least be remembered. A memorial with his name on it and 29 other soldiers was stolen by two grave robbers in 2011 without just cause. They have stolen at least five to eight memorials including a memorial to all veterans and those who died in attacks on our country. (Such as Pearl Harbor and 9-11) They do not own the memorials or the cemetery. This was done in secret without a vote of the membership or a public hearing. Even an epitaph was stolen off of a grave. Nothing was found wrong with these memorials at a public meeting afterwards. This shows disrespect to our soldiers and those who died including 400 policemen and firemen. We veterans want these memorials replaced.

They have stolen the only granite records of many of Warren area soldiers. A Warren man who put his life at risk deserves at the least to have his name on a granite memorial which may be his only historical legacy. Thousands of soldiers died and to have their only memorial ripped out by those to whom they died to give freedom to goes beyond insult and disrespect and boarders on treason. We veterans condemn these actions.

Much of our history including the story of many of our Warren boy soldiers has been lost due to just not being written down. Why do I call them boys. Well just look at the ages that most of our soldiers were when they were killed. Many were in fact still in their teens.
